












UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Agenda: Addressing the Impact of Climate Change as the Most Significant Threat to Future Generations.

Delegates will explore innovative and cooperative strategies to mitigate climate impacts and build a sustainable global future.

UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

Agenda: Deliberating on the Responsibility of Nations in Ensuring Protection and Support for Refugees

The UNSC Junior Forum, designed for delegates from Grades 6 to 8, offers a meaningful space for young voices to explore global peace and security issues. In today's world, many people are forced to leave their homes because of war, danger, or natural disasters. These individuals, known as refugees, often face tough challenges in finding safety and support. This session encourages junior delegates to understand the reasons behind the refugee crisis and to think about how countries around the world can work together to protect and help those in need. Through discussion and collaboration, delegates will begin shaping compassionate and thoughtful solutions for a better future.




SENIOR FORUM

UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

Agenda: Deliberating on the Responsibility of Nations in Ensuring Protection and Support for Refugees

The UNSC Senior Forum, composed of delegates from Grades 9 to 12, addresses one of the most urgent humanitarian challenges of our time—the global refugee crisis. As millions are displaced due to conflict, persecution, and climate-related disasters, the international community faces mounting pressure to uphold human rights and ensure adequate protection and support for refugees. This session calls on senior delegates to engage in high-level deliberations on the


legal, moral, and political responsibilities of nations, evaluate current international mechanisms, and propose robust strategies to strengthen global solidarity and safeguard the dignity and security of displaced populations.



DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE

Agenda: Regulating the Use of Surveillance Drones: Balancing National Security and Individual Privacy.

DISEC addresses global threats to peace and security,
especially those tied to disarmament and defense
technologies. With surveillance drones becoming increasingly
widespread, delegates must debate the fine line between
ensuring national security and protecting civil liberties, seeking
frameworks for ethical and controlled usage.



UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION

Agenda: Evaluating the Role of Social Media in Threatening Individual Privacy and Cultural Integrity.

UNESCO focuses on the protection of cultural heritage and the promotion of knowledge, education, and human rights. In this session, delegates will examine how social media—while a tool for connection and education—can also compromise personal privacy and erode cultural values. The committee aims to find a balance between digital freedom and cultural protection.



ALL INDIA POLITICAL PARTIES MEET

Agenda: Integrating Financial Literacy into Mandated School Curricula: A Step Towards Sustainable Development and Economic Empowerment.

The AIPPM brings together representatives from major political parties across India to engage in meaningful dialogue on national issues. This session focuses on the urgent need to embed financial literacy into the school curriculum. Delegates will deliberate on policies to equip students with essential life skills in personal finance, digital banking, budgeting, and responsible spending. The discussion will emphasize financial literacy as a tool for empowerment, economic inclusion, and sustainable development in a rapidly evolving economy.



WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION

Agenda: Inclusive Mental Health Policies for Individuals with Physical Disabilities and Chronic Illnesses like COPD, Alzheimer's Disease, etc.

As the global health authority, the WHO committee addresses critical public health challenges. This session centers on integrating mental health support into healthcare systems for individuals facing chronic illnesses and physical disabilities. Delegates will discuss barriers to mental healthcare, advocate for inclusive and rights-based policies, and propose models that ensure mental well-being is recognized as a core aspect of holistic healthcare. The aim is to create equitable systems that leave no one behind.



Agenda: Assessing India's Readiness for a Cashless Economy: Opportunities and Challenges.

The Lok Sabha, the lower house of India's Parliament, provides a forum for robust domestic policy debate.

Delegates will discuss the transition toward a cashless economy, evaluating its potential to boost transparency and efficiency against challenges like digital access, cybersecurity, and rural connectivity. Expect rigorous debate grounded in Indian socio-economic realities.



INTERNATIONAL PRESS

Agenda: Open to all Caricaturists, Reporters, and Photographers

The International Press serves as the voice and lens of the conference, capturing the essence of debate, diplomacy, and dynamic interactions. Open to all caricaturists, reporters, and photographers, this forum offers participants the opportunity to creatively document the proceedings, provide critical analysis, and highlight key moments across committees. Whether through sharp reporting, compelling imagery, or satirical art, members of the International Press play a vital role in shaping how the story of the conference is told—balancing truth, insight, and creativity in every piece they produce.
