What is Convention on Biological Diversity and when it was adopted and where? Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) is known as misual understanding or a treaty to conserve biological diversity and sustainable use of its component and adequate sharing of the benefits arising from genetic resources. During the Rio Art Summit in 1992, 22 May it was adopted. Within one year 168 countries signed this treaty and it was brought into force in 29 December 1993.

The main three objectives of this convention

Conservation of Biodiversity,

Sustainable use of Biodiversity,

Fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising from the genetic resources.

I think in our biological world each and every part has its own value and these are important for humankind, for which we should take importance on its conservation.

So, if we do not conserve biodiversity, if we do not go for plantation, the future of the human civilisation will be very dark.





China denies all allegations of human rights abuses in Xinjiang, claiming its system of "re-education" camps are there to combat separatism and Islamist militancy in the region.
