Prevent Digital Colonialism


TOPIC BACKGROUND

NATIONAL POLICY

- Personal Data Protection Law Amendment (2022): Proposed changes to Law 25.326 aim to expand sensitive data definitions and increase transparency in AI mechanisms, including the right to avoid purely algorithmic decisions, emphasizing personal data protection.
- Recommendations for Reliable AI (2023): Provision 2/2023 from the Undersecretariat of Information Technologies established ethical principles for AI development, emphasizing human oversight and accountability throughout the AI lifecycle.
- Program for Transparency and Data Protection (2023): Resolution 161/2023 created a framework promoting responsible AI development in both public and private sectors, focusing on awareness, education, accountability, and a comprehensive regulatory framework.
- Bill 3003-D-2024 (2024): This proposed legislation would establish a comprehensive legal framework for responsible AI use in Argentina, drawing inspiration from international approaches while addressing Argentina's specific needs for AI innovation.

AT REGULATION ARGENTINA: COMPLIANCE CONSIDERATIONS

- Data Privacy Requirements: Ensure AI systems comply with Argentina's Personal Data Protection Law, including consent mechanisms, purpose limitations, and data security measures, vital for reliable artificial intelligence.
- Risk Assessment Frameworks: Conduct impact assessments for high-risk AI applications, following the principles outlined in Resolution 161/2023.
- Transparency Obligations: Implement clear documentation of AI decision-making processes, particularly for systems affecting individual rights or access to services, crucial for ai regulatory obligations.

Argentina is ready to work with the global community to create inclusive and equitable artificial intelligence regulations. We think AI should benefit all countries equally and not be used as a means of digital colonialism. Argentina reaffirms its commitment to a fair and balanced digital future for all by encouraging the development of ethical AI, protecting data sovereignty, and aiding in the development of capacity in developing nations.
