## **Position** Paper

The Republic of Poland recognizes both the immense potential and the significant risks associated with the global development of Artificial Intelligence (AI). While AI promises to revolutionize industries and improve human lives, the Polish delegation firmly believes that, if left unchecked, it can also

become a tool for exploitation, deepening inequalities and leading to a new form of digital colonialism—where technologically dominant nations exert control over less developed states through data monopolies, surveillance mechanisms, and Al-driven decision-making systems.

As a proud member of the European Union, Poland supports the EU's position on ensuring ethical AI frameworks that prioritize transparency, accountability, and human rights. Poland advocates for global cooperation to regulate AI technologies in a manner that prevents their misuse by both state and non-state actors. The country emphasizes the sovereignty of data and the right of all nations—especially developing ones—to control their own digital infrastructure and AI development pathways. Poland proposes the formation of an international regulatory body under the UN that would:

Set binding ethical guidelines for Al development,

Prevent the monopolization of AI capabilities by a handful of powerful nations or corporations,

Support underdeveloped countries with funding, education, and technology-sharing to build indigenous AI capacity.

Poland also calls upon member states to recognize the inherent danger of algorithmic bias, especially in systems trained on

datasets primarily representing Western perspectives. It is essential that AI respects cultural diversity and promotes inclusive development rather than enforcing digital dependencies.

To conclude, the Republic of Poland firmly supports a global, inclusive, and democratic approach to AI governance. In the face of rising technological imperialism, we stand for digital justice, equal opportunity, and respect for the sovereignty of all nations.
