- 800 Stinger anti-aircrafts
- 2,000 javelin, 1,000 light anti-armor weapons
- 6,000 AT-4 anti-armor systems
- 100 tactical UAVs
- 100 Grenade Launchers
- 5,000 rifles
- 1,000 pistols
- 400 machine guns
- 400 shotguns
- 20 millions small ammunition, grenade launchers, motor rounds
- 25,000 sets of body armor
- 25,000 helmets

to Ukraine by the US.

Previous commitments by the United States of America to Ukraine includes: 600 Stigner ray anti-aircraft systems, over 2,000 javelins and much more that has been supplied

The United States of America has tied up with NATO to provide supplies to Ukraine which include; missiles, armor, etc.

President Joe Biden has also ordered a cut of sanctions on Russia which will stop the supply of resources.

24th February 2022 was the date marking the start of a possible World War 3. Russian soldiers were reported lurking and attacking major cities of Ukraine. This action taken by Russia is not justified and the United States of America has come up with solutions.
