**AGENDA: Improving Access to Immunisation and Halting the Spread of Vaccine-preventable diseases.**

The World Health Organization had hosted a Global Vaccination Summit on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2019 in Brussels, Belgium; this was a major conference which highlighted the importance of immunization globally, here it was recognized that:-

**“Vaccination is the most successful public health measure of modern times”**

Immunization is among the most effective public health interventions available. In recent decades, vaccines have contributed to substantial reductions in childhood disease burden globally, saving millions of lives. Immunization was the fundamental strategy for the eradication of smallpox— one of the greatest achievements in the history of public health.

Polio is now on the brink of eradication thanks again to the power of vaccines. More children than ever before now live healthy lives free of VPDs, because of immunization. Moreover, the impact of vaccines extends beyond public health to children’s educational performance, increases in household incomes and, ultimately, greater national economic growth.

The Delegate of United States would like to clear it’s stances on the topic , improving access to immunization and halting the spread of VPDs. The United States, through the DFC, is working to finance increased capacity to support Biological E’s effort to produce at least 1 billion doses of COVID-19 vaccines by the end of 2022 with Stringent Regulatory Authorization and World Health Organization (WHO), including the Johnson & Johnson vaccine which is to be supplied to the countries of Asia, thus improving the immunization programs globally.

US, together with its partners of Quad, have a positive stand towards the idea of Improving Immunization programs globally.

We shall steadily promote the globalization of Vaccine supply and of all multilateral agreements related to the promotion and distribution of vaccine under critical circumstances.
