Position Paper – Brazil

Standing together matters more now than ever. With gaps growing between rich and poor, storms worsening, forests shrinking, Brazil sees clear paths forward through shared effort instead of rivalry. Big challenges call for joint thinking, especially inside groups like the G20 where decisions shape worldwide outcomes. Not just a participant, Brazil brings unique strengths - vast ecosystems, deep-rooted cultures, fresh energy - to help build fairness across nations. Stability does not come by chance; it grows when values like balance, care, and fairness take root in policy. What happens next depends on choices made today, grounded in real change, not promises.

Brazil stands behind teamwork among nations, where every country moves forward together. One rule matters: respect each nation's right to choose its own path. Progress should reach everyone, not just the wealthy or powerful. Poorer countries deserve a fair chance.

Least-developed ones need extra attention. Shared growth is the goal. This way, no one gets left behind.

Brazil holds a vast stretch of the Amazon, placing it at the heart of Earth's ecological balance. Because of this weighty position, efforts lean on guarding nature while still moving economies forward.

Brazil steps forward with a call for robust global teamwork on climate issues, recognizing that shared duties still differ among nations. While fairness matters, joint efforts must rise.
